How will my child be supported during transition periods?

- · Extra visits to the new school / classroom

- Photographs of the new school to be used in discussion sessions and can be taken home for parents to use

- · Transfer Days

How will the school identify and assess my child for SEND?

Assessment depends on the child's area of need but could include testing the child at school and/or making a referral to an outside agency.



How will my child be involved?

- Work with the SENDCo to complete their Support Plans (where appropriate) for teachers to use when planning
- · Complete a One Page Pupil Profile with teacher
- TAs will gather feedback regarding support and interventions
- · Involvement in Annual Reviews
- · Have regular access to talk with the SENDCo
- · Pupils will set targets with teachers
- \cdot Talking with pupils about their strengths and their needs.
